Signpost 1 Listen! Listen! Listen!

That FIRST and very important word. HOW is GOD saying "Listen!" to you today? p. 33 My delivery hopes something will get "stuck" in your mind --that you have to wrestle with it, tug at it, have an "AHA!" with it or even----laugh.

What are we listening FOR? (Reader 2 p. 8) Benedict's Rule as a **path home**. p. 8-9

How does Benedict's Rule help us travel more lightly, freely, aware of God's presence?

Opening the Toolbox of St. Benedict's Rule

What tools lead us to LISTEN, OPEN, and FIND GOD in "the ORDINARY?"

The structure of the Rule is:

A prologue and 73 chapters, each one titled to describe its content.

Some specific main topics are: pp. 29-30

- * Divine Office or "Work of God"-----The eight daily times of community prayer ----that are the PRIMARY OCCUPATION of monastics.
- * Roles for community members-----Abbot (Abbess / Prioress), who is the superior or top leader of the community; cellarer, who distributes food/utensils to members; porter, who greets visitors at the gate. Focus is on qualities which ALL members need and descriptions of how they are to treat one another.

St. Benedict calls us to see the importance of "being" over "doing."

*Being a COMMUNITY-----Relationships, ways to form peace and harmony in every part of DAILY "living together."

Included are: the process of joining the community, meals, clothing, work, discipline and sleeping arrangements.

- *Spiritual Direction-----Nurturing our relationship with God through prayer, study, Lenten practices and pursuing Humility.
 - Sr. Joan Chittister** summarizes steps to humility as---- know that God is God, God's will is best for us, acknowledge faults, accept direction, learn from community members and listen to others, endure without growing weary. Be content with less than the best, let go of image-making, refrain from ridicule, speak kindly, be simple, serene. (Not in that exact order.)

Look at Benedict's Rule for practical and down-to-earth instructions for peacefully forming a community of belonging and fulfillment, listening and silence.

It is a way of learning together in "a school for the Lord's service.....

nothing harsh, nothing burdensome."

It calls for an extraordinary understanding of individual's weaknesses. It provides methods of guidance and help to amend faults and safeguard love. It encourages compassion for those who fail, have a hard heart,

or are troubled or distressed.

Sr. Joan Chittister describes Benedict's Rule as like a rail you can hold onto while ascending a staircase

Jane Tomain (p. 12) Tells us the word Rule comes from the Greek canon which means trellis--which supports the vine for greater fruitfulness (and flowering).

Is your "sense of things" that your direction

is about to shift, change, veer or stay on course "as is"? What tells you? How do you seek God's will? Little intuitions, realizations, insights, noticings? Tools: Listen! Open heart! God is in Everything!

God uses <u>all our "parts"</u>: body feeling mind spirit (gut) p. 37 others, senses, songs, art, movies...etc.

Discovery is usually gradual, found in threads in our past and our unfolding "now." Sometimes we find, like the Portugese proverb says, "God writes straight with crooked lines." The song, Broken Road by Rascal Flatts is an example of finding God's will
