Dear Alumnae,

I hope that this issue of "Jottings" finds you well!

You may remember from earlier messages that the sisters are in the midst of major planning for the future use of our various buildings and grounds. This summer, our consultants will present a variety of recommendations to the community. Then, we will spend some time discussing these ideas in order to determine priorities for the coming years. Please pray for us as we continue this important process.

One of the biggest changes happening on the hill this spring has been the decision to begin transitioning away from having our own licensed nursing facility within the monastery. Hildegard Health Center has served us well for 18 years, but as healthcare costs increase and the number of sisters requiring nursing care decreases, we have made the decision to begin moving our sisters in need of nursing care to Scenic Hills at the Monastery.

In 2019, Scenic Hills at the Monastery opened a brand new facility on land leased from the monastery. Several sisters are now residing at Scenic Hills, and we anticipate moving the rest of the sisters currently in Hildegard Health Center to Scenic Hills yet this year. Because the facility is located on our grounds, we can visit daily and provide prayer and companionship for our sisters there. Plus, our sisters' presence provides a ministry to the other residents! While a necessary move, it has also been difficult. Please pray for all of us in this time of transition.

In the last weeks and months, I have had the joy of seeing some of you returning to visit "on the hill." It is always a joy to see you, visit with you, and meet your families, too. Know that you are always welcome to return to campus and walk the grounds, visit the church, and inquire about some of your teachers. I look forward to welcoming many of you this fall for the annual reunion.

Know that you are always in our prayers. Please don't hesitate to reach out when you or your loved ones need prayer.

In the beginning, I was confused about my last minute school change and lack of certainty for my future at this new school. I was terribly homesick, but the welcome I received from the Sisters, international students, and American students made me feel most welcome to a huge new home!

I was welcomed by so many, but the ones that come to mind are Amy Conrey, Shannon Mattingly, Raffella Romano, Jenny Pierson, Allison Grey, Kristen Gruber, Bina Haque, Falisha Ball, Clare Cook, Bridget Graham,

Rhonda Farmer, Sandy Steve, Julie Fabb, Trish Krampe, and of course Kristi Pnacek.

Spending weekends with my new friends was full of adventures. We traveled all over Southern Indiana and part of Kentucky. I spent time with my roomie Hitomi Okumura at our "American parents" home. We learned how to water ski in Santa Claus, Indiana, and all about the Kentucky Derby while in Louisville. I went to my first American concert with Rory Gillingham. It was New Kids on the Block and it was a blast! I was able to explore SW Indiana and learn about its history with Amy Conrey.

I was so honored when I was eventually asked to be a big sister to a new, incoming girl.

I was raised in a non-practicing Catholic home. I learned about my faith, spirituality, religion, and love for new cultures and world views at Marian Heights Academy.

I learned of the 13 colonies from Mr. Lawrence, World Religions from Sister Cathryn, love of the arts from Sister Francesca, and Home Economics from Sister Anna.

To this day, I use the lessons that I learned at Marian Heights Academy in my daily professional life. My deep faith and spirituality have provided a natural path for me to help others as a psychologist and by teaching others how to bring faith and spirituality into their daily lives as a guide for people at the El Camino de Santiago (The Saint James Way) in Spain. I also enjoy teaching in many subjects, especially those that pertain to self-awareness, self-love, meditation, physical and mental health, and wellbeing.

One of the greatest lessons my father taught me as he was leaving me at MHA was to learn English. "English will open the doors of the world to you." My father was right.
